The cottages are a physical reminder of the labour strikes at Raspberry Gully and attempts by the coal company at strike breaking in the 1880s, thus they also have significance in the labour history of NSW. The cottages are exemplars of the way of life of early Charlestown settlers, and evoke feelings in the district of a continuing association with the mining community. The cottages are the only remaining obvious relics of the Waratah Coal Company (the founders of Charlestown) and its nearby Raspberry Gully pit. The cottages are representative of the prevailing style of building in the coal fields of the 19th Century. Comparable groups of such early buildings are now rare. The cottage's style, and its similarity to another early Government office in Lake Macquarie, indicates that it must have a significant place in the history of Charlestown.
