





Important later buildings include the 1918 Water Tower, 1930s Sanitarium Factory & 1940s Auditorum. all adopting very advanced design ideas for their time & place.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The Avondale venture was unique in NSW, combining a religious community, a college & a manufactory, set in remote bushland, far from Sydney & Newcastle, with all members living by & thriving on a particular philosophy. Siting of the Sanitarium factory at Avondale, where goods had to be shipped down Dora Creek & across the Lake, indicates the early importance of water transport of goods. Avondale has a unique collection of buildings, of State significance aesthetically & architecturally. It includes surviving 19th Century College buildings which adapt American philosophies to work with local construction & materials. In the 1930s the Adventists adopted the latest international architectural ideas. 

The few rust stains appear to have been caused by peripheral structures such as the steel ladder, & what may be some badly placed reinforcing in the rim at the base of the tank. The water tank is a handsome structure & something of a landmark on the approaches to the College & the Sanitarium Factory. The earliest surviving Australian concrete water tower, a massive structure at Mildura, is only 8 years older.






