





Another "Teralba Cemetery", near Rhondda Colliery, is shown on the Teralba Parish Map as being dedicated on 5th June 1894 (TA-22). This one was not found either. None at present. The headstones are mostly destroyed and many INTERPRETATION: graves are unmarked. Recommend signs giving the period the cemetery was in use, and the names, date of birth & death, etc., of the people buried here. Abandoned, and becoming overgrown with natural bush and CONSERVATION ACTIVITY: grasses. The cemetery had survived long neglect, but was recently vandalised, and all headstones but one have been smashed. Local community care is needed. Disused, but the graves still exist.
