Few early buildings survive, but the town retains a picturesque quality which could easily be destroyed by inappropriate development.</p> <p>The small delineated Conservation Area in the REP includes the commercial centre & school, but no mine sites or early development west of the railway. The centre of the town changed from the west to the east side of the railway after the first 20 years, but considerable relics of early Teralba could be found & interpreted. PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS Townscape or Landscape Features: Teralba is laid out along an east facing hill, with the railway running across the centre. The town is noticed as a compact collection of buildings from the hill in Boolaroo, on the other side of Cockle Creek. Historic Teralba once stretched to the Creek edge, but early structures Other Details of Physical Appearance: close to the creek have been demolished. The small delineated Conservation Area in the REP includes the commercial centre & school, but no mine sites or early development west of the railway.																								
DESCRIPTION: All surface structures of the 1886 Great Northern mine have gone, but the same site is still a mine. West of the railway are the streets which are all that remain of the 1st Teralba settlement of 1884, related to railway construction. On the same side of the railway are many miner's houses, remains of the Gartlee mine, the owner's house, & the Stationmaster's Cottage. East of the line are the Great Northern Hotel, some businesses & churches, & the school, all belonging to the 2nd stage of town development.																								
MODIFICATIONS: Town centre changed to its present location on the east (Lake) side of the railway 20 years after the town was established on the west side of the line.																								
PRESENT USE: A minor suburban centre, still ringed by the industries which caused its development, but no longer dependant on them for survival.																								
HISTORICAL NOTES: Part of Ranclaud grant, land later owned by Quigleys. First settled 1884 when railway contractors opened a ballast quarry. Great Northern Coal Co. & Stockton Borehole both started 1886. Railway opened 1887. Northern Extended or Gartlee Colliery started 1890. First freehold land sold in 1911. Town development is still influenced by quarrying and coal mining.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: Teralba is closely associated with the coming of the railway to Lake Macquarie, & the railway was closely linked to the choice of site for Teralba's mines. The centre of the town changed from the west to the east side of the railway after the first 20 years, but considerable relics of early Teralba could be found & interpreted. There is certainly enough historic significance in the location of the early boundaries to justify enlarging the perimeter of the delineated Conservation Area. Teralba is no longer a trading centre dependant on the railway quarries & coal mines for its existence, but life in the town is still strongly influenced by the movement of coal & quarry materials. Few early buildings survive, but the town retains a picturesque quality which could easily be destroyed by inappropriate development.

DESCRIPTION: A gable roofed shed type of building, with a sloping floor & a projection box built into the front gable. The wide front doorway & shop windows appear original, as do the imitation brickwork & roughcast stucco pressed-metal panels on the gable end. It appears to be in sound condition. This was a very basic & styleless building, preceding the cinema palace era, & fitting the working class background of the town.				
MODIFICATIONS: Cladding on lower front wall is "Ranch" style weatherboards c1950s. Front awning had posts but is now suspended. Projection box has been converted to a mezzanine display area.				
PRESENT USE: Shop for new & used furniture & antiques.				
HISTORICAL NOTES: 1st movie said to have been shown in the town in 1901, but this building dates from c1920. "Breakfast at Tiffany's" is said to have been the last feature film shown in the building. As that film was showing provincially around 1963, this is probably the year the cinema closed. Not known how long it was disused.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: A building of some significance in the social life of Teralba. The Lake Cinema at Boolaroo is about the same age, but is a more substantial construction & still in use as a cinema. The building form is representative of the early 20th Century commercial style of buildings in Teralba many of which have now been demolished. The pressed metal cladding materials are rare and interesting survivals of once widely used decorative devices for timber buildings.

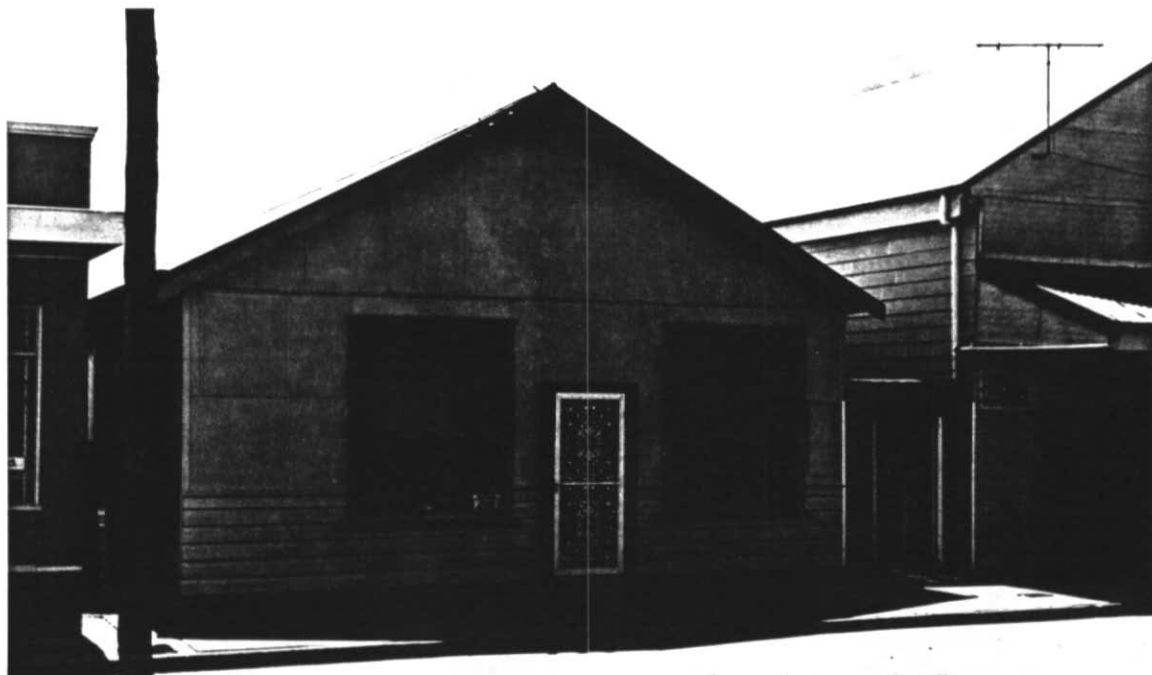

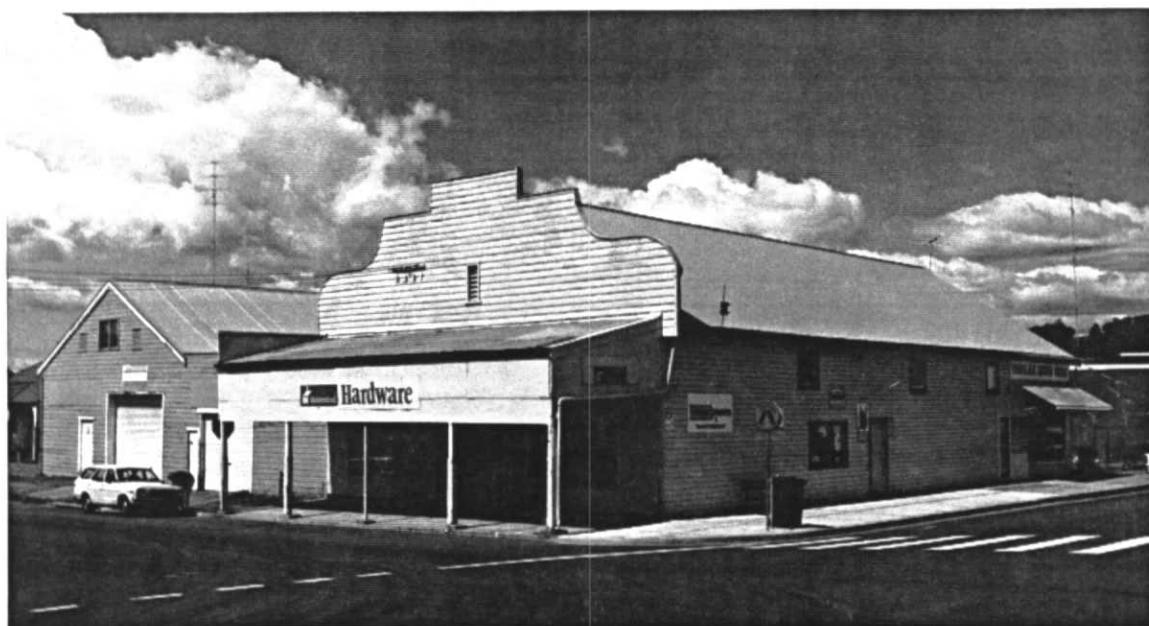

DESCRIPTION: Gable roof with wide eaves is mostly concealed behind a grandiose rebated weatherboard clad timber-framed Dutch gable. This & the street awning seem little changed from when they were built (c1915?) A large gable-roofed store-shed has been linked to the main building on the east side.																								
MODIFICATIONS: few. Addition of a gable-roofed shed on the east side, probably some time in the 1920s. Alterations to some openings.																								
PRESENT USE: Hardware shop																								
HISTORICAL NOTES: TC Frith's first store was opened in an already existing 1880s store near the Gt Northern Colliery (cnr William & Margaret Sts), followed by a store at Boolaroo (1898). The firm built the existing store c1915, & a much larger brick one in Toronto c1925 (exact dates are not recorded, nor the date TC Frith ceased business).

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: TC Frith & Co., General Storekeepers, was a well known business in Lake Macquarie, with several prosperous branches around the Lake. The Frith family were leaders in community affairs in the Shire. The existing family store building in Teralba is not the first, or the most important of their chain, but it does still represent the significant place that the Frith family held in the community for most of a century. The building form is representative of the early 20th Century commercial style of buildings in Teralba many of which have now been demolished.

DESCRIPTION: A domestic style building, probably dating from the 1920s. The building is inconsistent in its materials & detailing. It is said to have been built near the station & moved to the present site in the 1920s, with the residence then built onto the north side. Except for the ripple iron ceilings & beaded wall lining, the whole building fits a 1920s construction date, with much later alterations to windows etc.

MODIFICATIONS: The horizontally divided panes of the double hung sashes are a much later style than the rest of the building.

PRESENT USE: Post Office

HISTORICAL NOTES: The first Post office in Teralba was opened 1st Jan 1885, probably near where the station was built two years later, because the first Stationmaster (HF Nesbitt) was also the Post-master. The Post Office function was moved to its present location in c1924, after the centre of the town moved east across the railway.

The area of burning subterranean coal is fenced off, with signs warning of subsidence, but no smoke is visible.

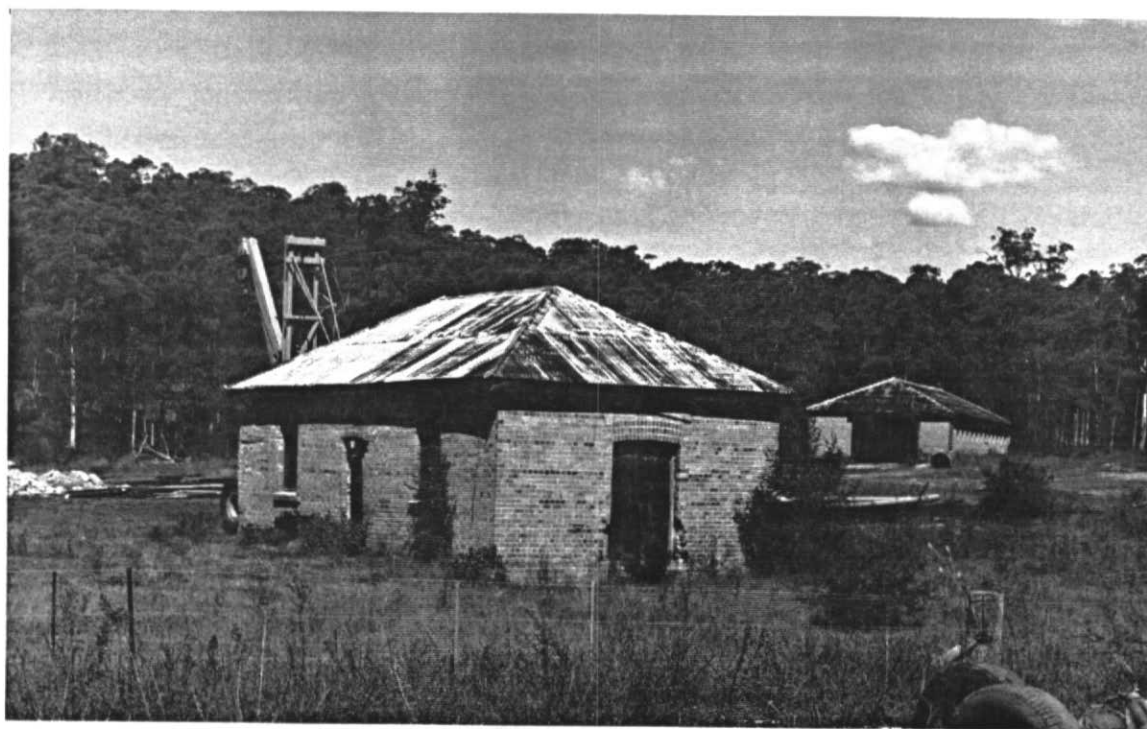
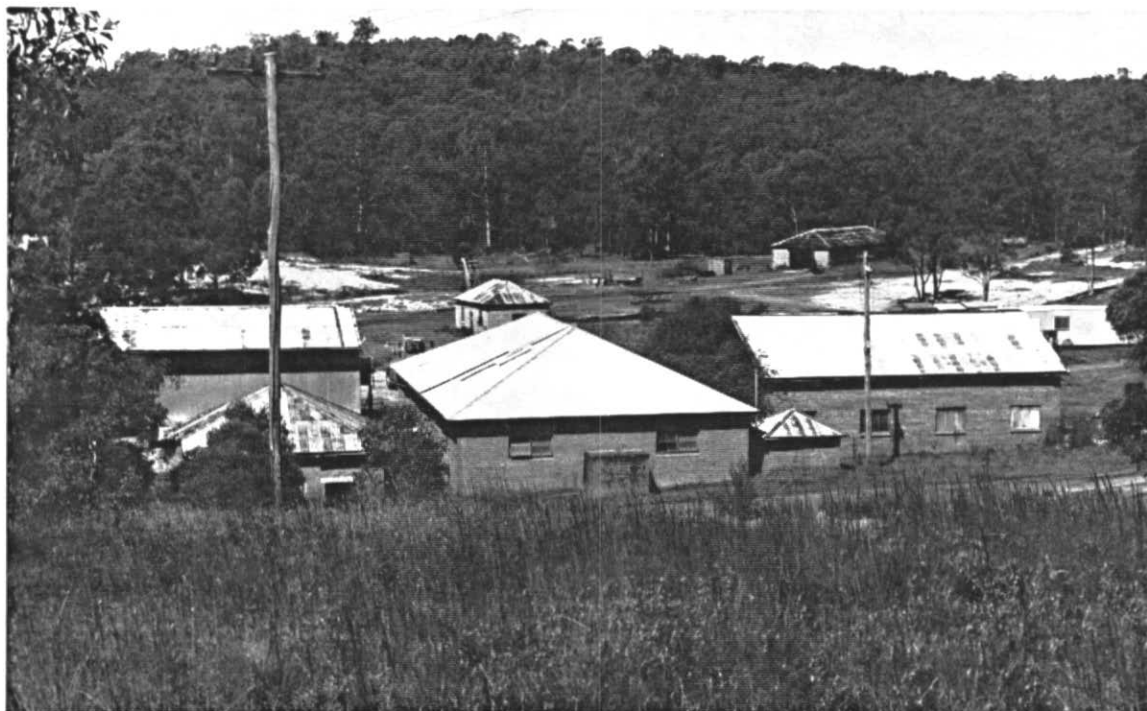

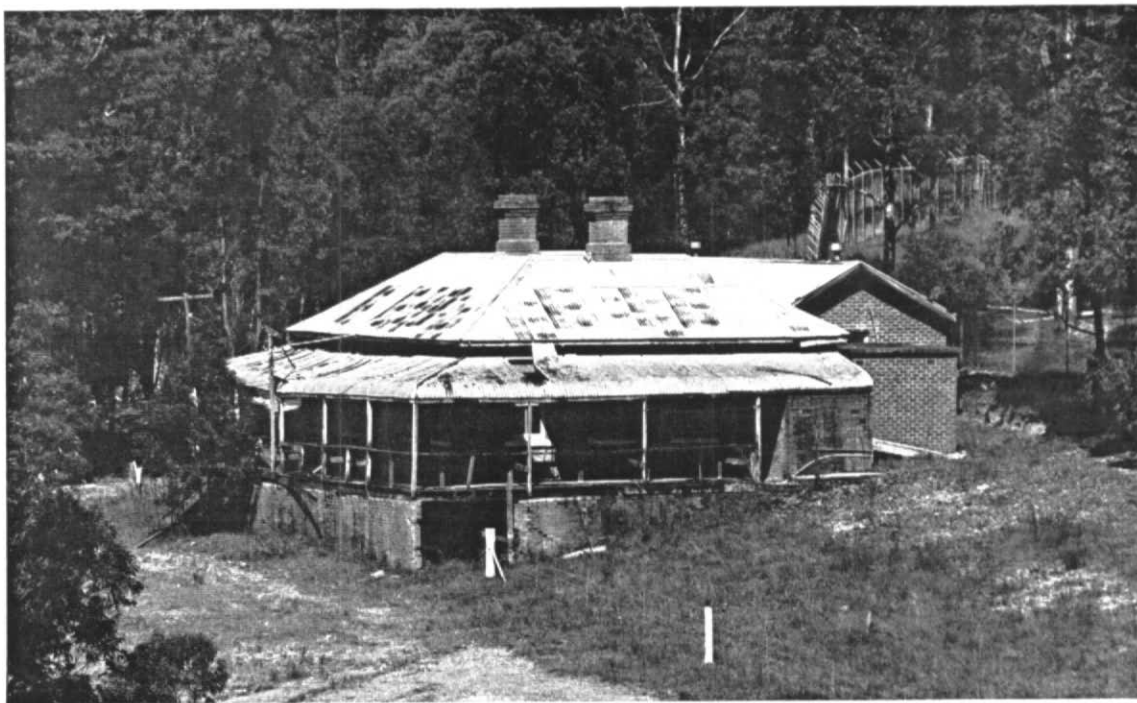

Curiously, the Wallsend 1:25,000 Map and Awaba Parish Map both show a cemetery on the east side of the railway, south of the Booragul loop (Map.ref.689 497). It is shown as 4 acres, notified 17th July 1931. No trace of this cemetery could be found on the ground, and it has not been given an item number.

An existing cemetery on the east slopes of Billygoat Hill, which appears never to have been dedicated at all, and had been "lost" for many years, and sadly vandalised, is described in (TA-13).

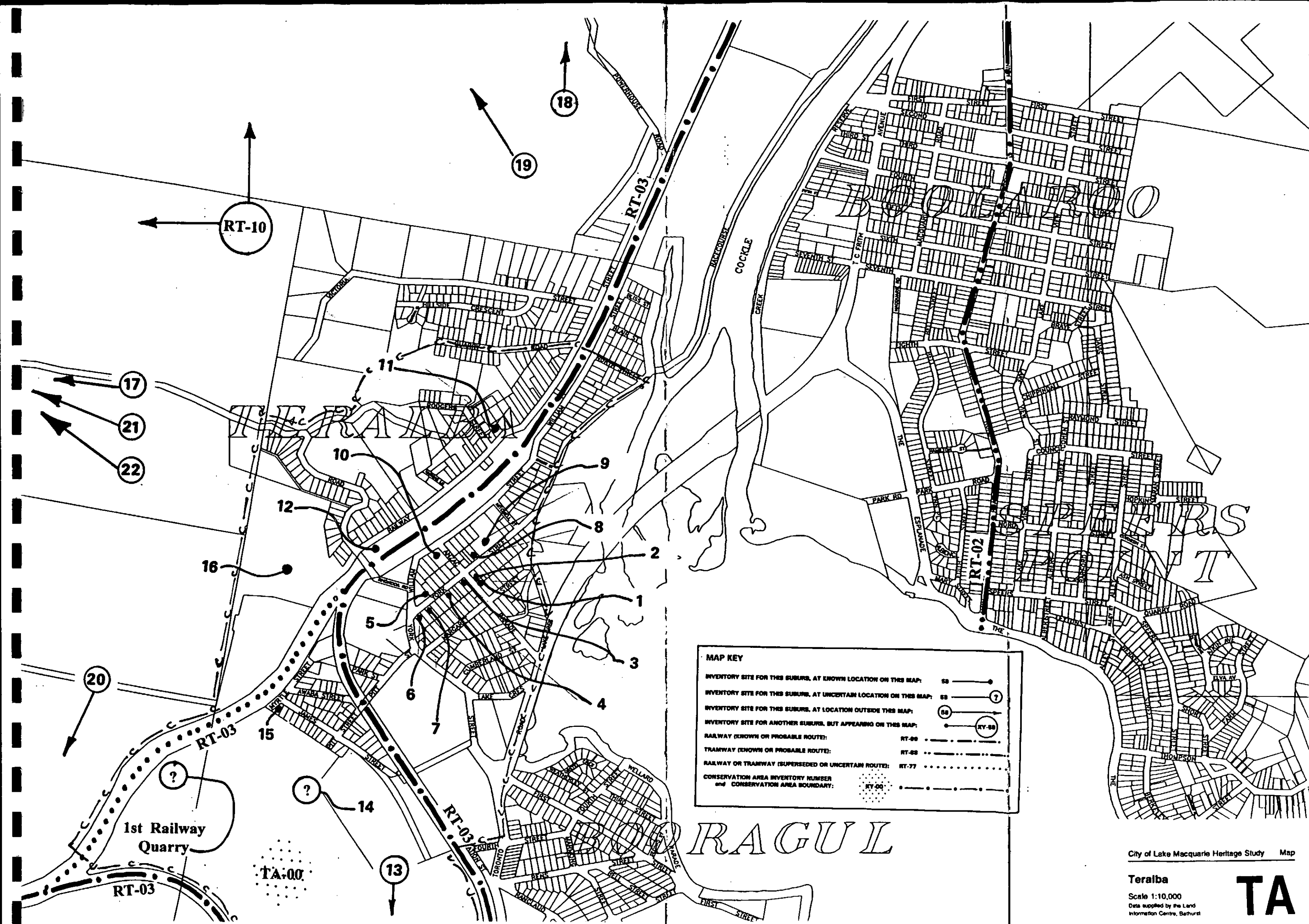
