GROUP NEWS also been reached with a Japanese steel mill for the sale of five million tons of low grade ore over a period of 10 years. Satisfactory arrangements have been made for the financing of the iron ore export and pelletising projects.

Production of rutile and zircon at T.A.Z.I.'s mineral sand mining opera-tion on North Stradbroke Island, Queensland, was slightly greater than in the corresponding period of 1964. Output is being more than doubled to approximately 30,000 tons of rutile and 20,000 tons of zircon per annum, commencing second half 1965, for a capital cost of £1.3 million.

Performance of the plant of Rio Tinto Brick Pty. Limited at Campbell-

field, Victoria, showed an improvement over the previous six months, and all the output was sold. Emphasis upon product quality has been maintained, and a new dark brick was introduced.

Mineral Exploration activities have included, as announced in May of this year, investigation of large deposit of low grade copper ore in Bougainville. Work necessary to assess the economics of this is proceeding and in addition, prospecting work of a reconnaissance nature is in progress in some of the eastern islands of the Territory of New Guinea.
