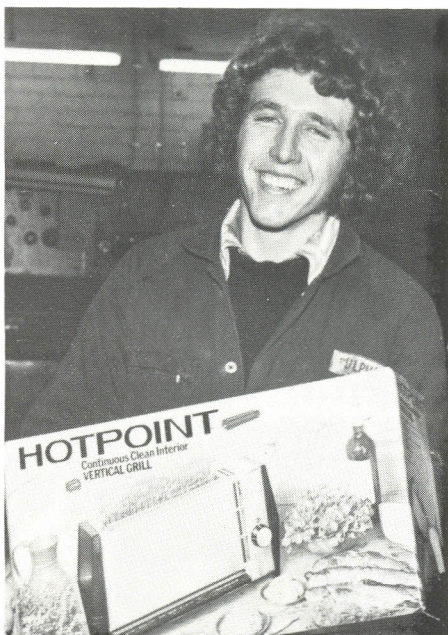


Wedding

Quite apart from the safety issue involved it has been recognised for many years throughout heavy industry that wool, because of its heat resistant and absorbant properties, is better suited for garments than man made synthetic fibres.
