

# 1984 Sulphide Scholarships

Each year as part of this support we award a scholarship, currently valued at \$175.00, to the outstanding student of Year 10 at each school, to continue into Year 11. 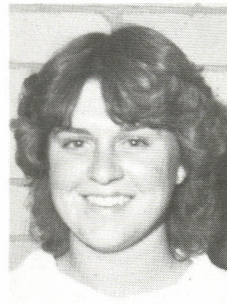

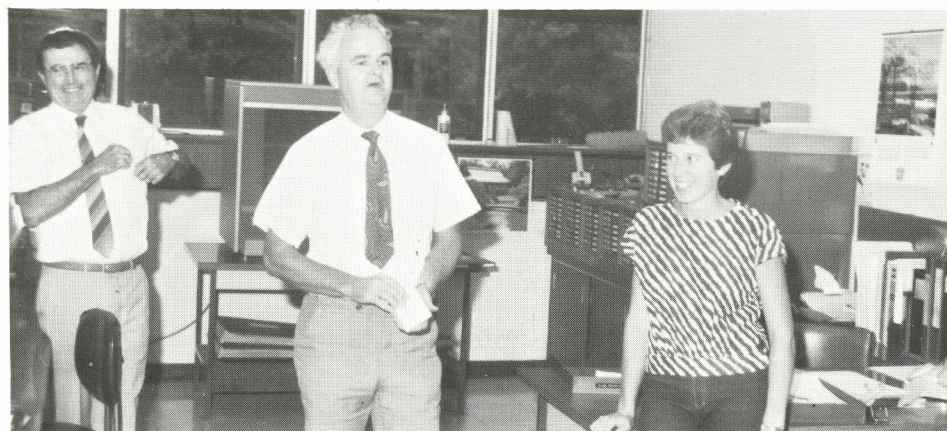
With the recent amalgamation of our two Engineering Departments she transferred back to the Commercial
