

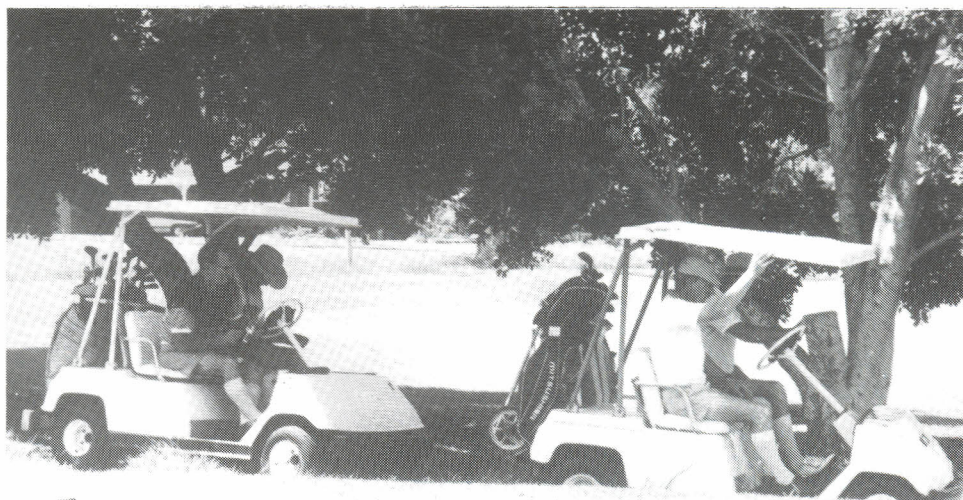
# GOLF MANIA

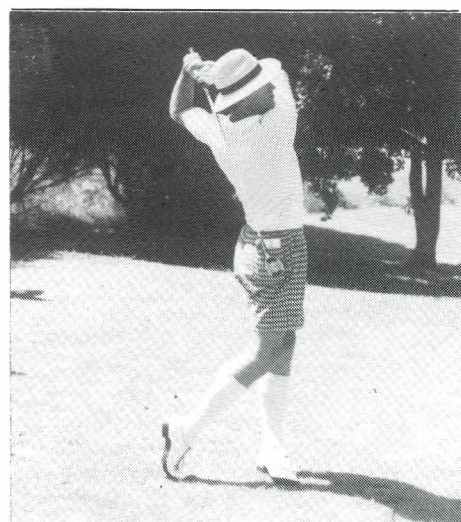
