Profits will improve if we meet our production targets, if we contain our costs, and if the current high zinc price remains favourable.

We'll continue with our sintering trials, to improve metallurgical control so that we can treat more residues. We have a special project team working full-time in this area.



GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENT

We had a solid year's performance in 1987, but I was disappointed that we didn't achieve our production targets. We still have some work to do in extracting the maximum performance from each of our plants.

But we saw enough during 1987 to know that we can reach high production levels. Our challenge in 1988 is to improve plant performance so that we can consistently run at high levels. We also have to prepare for a very big Campaign Shutdown in early 1989.

We'll do all of this by using to the full, the proven talents of all of our people.
