SIR,

WITH Reference to your Application for Land, dated the 29 March 1829, I am directed by HIS EXCELLENCY the GOVERNOR to inform you, that, on applying to the Surveyor General, you will receive a written Authority (for which you will pay him a Fee of 2s. 6d.) to select *Twelve hundred and Eighty* Acres, according to the Regulations of 5th September, 1826, and 21st August, 1828. *conditions which will be hereafter communicated to you.*

When you have made the Selection, you will be pleased to apprise the Surveyor General, by Letter, of the Situation of the Land; adding such a Description of the Boundaries, and other Particulars, as will enable that Officer to include your Name in his first subsequent Half-Monthly Return, and to report, for the GOVERNOR'S Information, whether there be any objection to your obtaining the Spot selected.

You will be pleased to observe, that the present Order is only for Authority to select, which gives no Power to take Possession of Land; and that the Selection must be made and notified to the Surveyor General within Four Months from the Date of this Letter; otherwise the Order now given will be null and void.

If the Selection be approved of by HIS EXCELLENCY, you will afterwards receive from this Office a written authority to take Possession of the Land, and to retain the same on the Conditions of a *Reserve* (which will then be specified), until His Majesty's Pleasure be made known on the Subject, or until a regular Deed be made out in your Favour.
