





STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: When Reid discovered the entrance to Lake Macquarie by mistake, in 1800, he probably mistook Moon Island for what is now called Nobby's Head at the entrance to Newcastle. If this was so, one could say that Moon Island was responsible for the discovery of Lake Macquarie.			
Apart from that conjecture, Moon Island is a recognised sanctuary for breeding seabirds. Being difficult of access, it has fortunately remained a safe refuge, in contrast to the developed and over-run former breeding areas on the mainland.
