It is robust & durable and has served the State well since 1957 as a major link on the Ma Northern Line from Sydney to Newcastle. The deviation and new bridge made possible to convert the old bridge to become the most heavily used north-road west of the Lake. This road might still not exist if the old rail bridge not become available.
