Sir,

I have the honor by the direction
of His Excellency the Governor to ac-
quaint you for the information of
the Officers of the Royal Veteran Com-
panies who have been disbanded, that
they will receive the following indul-
gences on their sending in an appli-
cation and certifying upon Honor, that
it is their intention immediately to
reside on and cultivate the Land which
may be assigned to them; viz^t

Subaltern Officers

1st - Two Square Miles of Land
free of Quit Rent.

2nd

2nd — Rations for themselves, their Wives and Children according to the usual proportions, for twelve Months from the date of Disbandment, together with Rations and Clothing for one Convict servant for the same period.

3rd — Two Convict Mechanics for six Months from the time of taking possession of their Land, to assist in erecting their House

4th Six Cows from the Government Herd, and the following Implements of Husbandry; Six

- 4 Four Felling Axes
- 6 Six Pick axes
- 1 one Grindstone
- 1 one Mattock
- 6 Six Hoes
- 6 Six Spades
- 3 Three Shovels
- 2 Two Wheelbarrows
- 3 Three Hammers
- 10000 Ten thousand, Latten Nails and
Floor Nails. — aged
- 1 one Common Steel Nail

5th — I am further directed to
notify, that if the officers fail to become
resident within three Months on the
Land which they may have selected,
they will be considered as having
forfeited their claim to all the
above indulgences, and also to the
Land itself which they may have
selected; And further, Should they
not be actually resident on the Land
to be granted to them under this
regulation, within three years from
the date of their disbandment, any
Land which they may have selected
subsequent to the forfeiture of the other
Indulgences, will not be confirmed by
Grant.
